

'Only one in four South Africans with a mental disorder has obtained some form of treatment. This is in line with the World Health Organization (WHO) surveys that show that between 76%-85% of people with severe mental disorders in low- and middle-income countries receive no treatment.'




According to the WHO, mental health conditions are the third leading cause of disability in the world. SA morbidity data indicates that mental disorders are the 3rd highest contributor to the local burden of disease, after HIV and other infectious diseases.


Mental health services are the Cinderella of health service provision despite it being the third highest burden of disease in SA!


