Operation Phakisa was launched in July 2014 by President Jacob Zuma following a state visit to Malaysia where he was introduced to Malaysia's Big Fast Results Methodology, which that country used successfully to achieve rapid economic transformation. This initiative represents a different spirit of moving faster in meeting government's targets; with the South African Government's starting point being that the country is surrounded by a vast ocean which has not fully taken advantage of the immense potential of this untapped resource. The programme concentrates on optimising the economic potential of South Africa's Oceans focusing on six priority potential growth areas –Marine Transport and Manufacturing; Offshore Oil and Gas Exploration; Aquaculture; Marine Protection Services and Ocean Governance; Small Harbours Development; as well as Coastal and Marine Tourism. This discussion aims to explore thoughts for sustainable growth of the ocean economy that will maximise socio-economic benefits while ensuring adequate ocean environmental protection.
