*There is a strong possibility that the 2019 general election will not yield an outright winner. Many argue that the ANC will not get more than 50% of the vote – forcing it to form a coalition government. The opposition parties may also band together, as they did in major metros in 2016, to keep the ANC from governing. Are the current coalitions in the metros a gauge of how well (or not) coalition governance can work? Or is it, as Dr Ivor Sarakinsky puts it, a case of “When people go to vote, they vote for a party and not a coalition. The will of the people cannot be aggregated.”?*
