Refugees, Migrants and Displaced Persons

The Holy See has called for migration policies that keep intact the family unit, and has decried legal impediments which make family unity difficult. On 12th October 2017, Archbishop Jurkovic, the leader of the Holy See's Observer Mission to the UN Geneva, pointed out that there are close to one billion people with some sort of migration status. He said that statistic is "a tangible sign of increasing inequalities, socio-economic imbalances, and unregulated globalization." He regretted that the immediate response to irregular migration is all too often one based on security.

In the UK there is a vigorous campaign to protect the rights of unaccompanied minors who are technically, under the Dublin Agreement, entitled to stay in the UK because they have family there. There will be protest actions on 24th October, the day Parliament debates the immigration aspects of Brexit. Issues of family reunification have become a key aspect of immigration policies, with most governments proposing very restrictive interpretations to such possibilities.

In the wake of the terrorist attack on 31st October in New York City, President Trump again called for extreme vetting of all entering the USA, greater border controls, and tighter internal immigration controls. Extreme vetting for people from certain countries such as Syria, Sudan and South Sudan includes the need to supply addresses and phone numbers of every place stayed in over the past ten years. The Administration has also hinted at reviewing the benefits and protection offered to holders of 'Temporary Protected Status', which offers protection to those who entered the USA without documents due to natural disasters, armed conflict, or extraordinary circumstances. Commentators are saying the President Trump is systematically putting into policy the promises around immigration made during the presidential campaign.
